Sport at Mt Maria College

At Mt Maria College, sport is more than just physical activity—it's a vital part of our students' holistic development. Our Sport Program is designed to offer a wide range of opportunities that foster personal growth, community spirit, and lifelong skills.

We recognise and value the importance of sport in shaping character and building resilience. Whether students are participating in interhouse competitions or representing the College at regional and national levels, our emphasis remains firmly on:

- Sportsmanship Respecting others, playing fair, and showing humility in both victory and defeat.
- Teamwork Collaborating effectively, supporting peers, and contributing to a shared goal.
- Commitment Showing dedication through consistent effort and participation.
- Strong Work Ethic Striving for excellence and embracing challenges with determination.

Tiered Structure of the Sport Program

To ensure every student has access to sport at a level that suits their interests and abilities, Mt Maria College operates a **three-tier model**:

Tier 1: College-Based Competitions

- SECA Season 1 & Season 2
- SECA Gala Days
- Interhouse Swimming, Cross Country, Athletics

These events form the foundation of our sport culture, encouraging broad participation and school spirit.

Tier 2: Representative Pathways

- SECA Swimming, Cross Country, Athletics
- Mt Maria College Representative Sports

Tier 2 events are the pinnacle of our College Sporting Program – a focus on sporting excellence and achievement.

Tier 3: External Pathways

- District North District Trials
- Regional Met North Trials
- State School States
- National School Nationals

This tier provides elite athletes with the opportunity to compete at higher levels, showcasing their talents beyond the College and contributing to broader sporting communities.

Assessment Special Provisions & Sport

Mt Maria College tier 1, 2, and 3 sporting opportunities may often fall on the same day as a scheduled assignment due date or an examination date. It is the student's responsibility to ensure they are up to date with relevant assessment and schoolwork prior to the commencement of a sporting competition. The College reserves the right to remove students from sporting opportunities who have not met academic expectations both with classwork and assessment. Where there are clashes between a sporting event and an assessment due date, the tiering sport system is utilised to assess the provision:

Tier 1 Sports Special provisions may not be accepted; students will likely be required to complete assessment as scheduled.

Tier 2 Sports Special provisions will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Clashes with scheduled examinations will be reviewed upon submission of application, with the school unlikely to approve a

change in examination date.

Tier 3 Sports Special provision applications will be approved upon review.

Please note:

- students are responsible for submitting a special provision document in a timely manner prior to the assessment date.
- the College will follow non-submission academic procedures in the event where a student fails to produce a special provision prior to the assessment and representative sport date.

Interhouse Sporting Program: Building Spirit Through Sport

At Mt Maria College, sport is more than just competition—it's a celebration of community, participation, and personal achievement. Our Interhouse Sporting Program is a cornerstone of College life, offering students the chance to engage in spirited competition, represent their House, and strive for personal excellence.

Swimming Carnival

The year kicks off with the Interhouse Swimming Carnival at Lawnton Aquatic Centre. Students travel by bus and dive into a day of excitement, choosing between competitive 50m events and non-competitive participation races. Competitive swimmers earn points toward Age Champion titles and may be selected for the SECA Swimming Team.

Competitive/SECA Events: 50m Butterfly, Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle, House Relays

Participation Events: 3x 50m swims, House War Cry

Cross Country Carnival

Held at Teralba Park, the Cross Country Carnival challenges students across age-based distances. Whether you're racing for the Age Champion title or cheering on your peers, this event fosters endurance and team spirit.

Athletics Carnival

The final carnival of the year takes place on the College playing fields. Students compete in a wide range of track and field events, with some other events—like Discus, High Jump, 800m, and 1500m—held in the lead-up to the main day. Participation in competitive events is essential for Age Champion eligibility and SECA team selection.

Absence from age championship events disqualifies students from Age Champion consideration, so attendance and engagement are vital.

The Interhouse Sporting Program is a vibrant expression of College spirit, encouraging every student to get involved, challenge themselves, and support their peers. Whether you're racing for gold or cheering from the sidelines, your presence makes a difference.

2. SECA Sport – Participation and Excellence

Mt Maria College is a proud member of the Southeast Colleges Association (SECA), competing against various North and South Brisbane Catholic Secondary Colleges. Students participate in the 'Big 3' Carnivals, Gala Days, and Seasonal Sporting activities, all conducted during school hours. This scheduling allows students to engage in other School Representative (tier 2 and 3) sporting opportunities or external club sports on weekends. Training commitments for these events, if offered, are generally scheduled before or after school.

SECA Carnivals

The **SECA Carnivals** are significant sporting events held at our College. These prestigious interschool events showcase the strength, spirit, and skill of our students across three major disciplines: **Swimming, Cross Country**, and **Athletics**. Participation in these carnivals is not only a mark of individual excellence but also a proud moment of team representation at the highest level against North and South SECA Schools.

Team and Individual Recognition

SECA Carnivals are **team-based competitions**, where schools accumulate points from all participants across all events. The school with the highest total points is crowned the overall winner. In addition to team accolades, **individual honours** are awarded:

- Age Champion: Determined by the highest individual points scored in each age group.
- Age Group School Champion: Awarded to the school with the most points in a specific age and gender division.

Swimming Carnival

Held annually at the Chandler Aquatic Centre, the Swimming Carnival features:

- Individual Events: 50m Butterfly, Backstroke, Breaststroke, and Freestyle.
- Team Events: Age group 4x50m relays.

Eligibility for the SECA Swimming team is based on performance in **age champion and competitive events** at the College's Interhouse Swimming Carnival.

Cross Country Carnival

Hosted at Teralba Park, Mitchelton, this event challenges endurance and determination:

- 12–13 Years (Boys & Girls): 3km
- 14-15 Years (Boys & Girls), 16-17+ Years (Girls): 4km
- **16–17+ Years (Boys)**: 6km

Selection for the SECA Cross Country team is based on results from the Interhouse Cross Country Carnival.



Held at the Queensland State Athletic Centre, this carnival showcases speed, strength, and agility:

- Track Events: 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m, 4x100m Relays
- Field Events: Shotput, Discus, Javelin, Long Jump, High Jump

Students qualify for the SECA Athletics team through competitive performance at the Interhouse Athletics Carnival.

Participation in SECA Carnivals is a testament to a student's commitment, talent, and school pride. These events not only foster athletic development but also build camaraderie and a strong sense of community spirit



SECA Gala Days

The SECA Gala Days are a highlight of the interschool sporting calendar, offering students a prestigious platform to showcase their athletic talents against SECA North and South schools. These events are fiercely competitive, with team selections determined through rigorous trial processes. In most cases, only one team per event is permitted, underscoring the elite nature of participation and the honour of representing Mt Maria College.

Cricket

Held as a two-day carnival in **Term 1**, the SECA cricket competition currently follows the **outdoor format**. Students earn their place through dedicated training sessions, culminating in selection to represent the college. Mt Maria's **senior girls cricket team** has become a symbol of excellence, having **won every year since the inception of the girls division**. This event is a golden opportunity for aspiring cricketers to contribute to the college's legacy of success.



Rugby 7s

A crowd favourite and a **Mt Maria sporting highlight**, Rugby 7s is where the college truly shines. Mt Maria boasts the **largest rugby program in the SECA system**, and this dominance is evident across the two-day event. Day one features the boys, followed by the girls on day two, as students take to the field in this **fast-paced**, **athletic version of rugby union**. Success in Rugby 7s demands **agility**, **speed**, **and strength**, and Mt Maria's athletes consistently rise to the challenge.

The AFL Gala Day rounds out the year in **Term 4**, drawing in students eager to earn selection for the SECA AFL teams. The event features **junior and intermediate divisions** for both boys and girls, played in a **9-a-side format**. It's a day where the best athletes converge, and Mt Maria students consistently demonstrate their prowess and passion for the game.

Participation in SECA Gala Days is more than just sport—it's about **teamwork**, **school pride**, **and personal growth**. These events foster a competitive spirit and provide a stage for students to challenge themselves and celebrate their achievements.



SECA Seasons

The SECA Season offers students a dynamic opportunity to engage in competitive and recreational activities across two terms:

- Season 1: 3 full days of competition in Term 2
- Season 2: 3 full days of competition in Term 3



3. Representative Sport

Mt Maria College offers an extensive **Tier 2 Representative Sport Program** for students seeking opportunities beyond our core SECA sporting program. This initiative allows students to trial for and potentially represent the College in a variety of sports against schools across Queensland. Note: offerings each year may change – increase or decrease – dependent upon our coaching and administrative capacity.

Sports Offered (subject to change)

Note:

- Sports offered may vary depending on coaching availability, student interest, calendar conflicts, and competition structures.
- Competitions may be added or removed based on timelines, capacity, and demand.
- Most sports do not follow fixed seasons; competition dates may vary by age and gender divisions.
- This is a performance-based program. Playing time is determined by the coach and may differ between players.

Costs

All Tier 2 sports involve additional costs. Estimated costs are listed throughout the handbook, however are subject to change if outgoing expenses change. The final costs will be shared prior to team trials on the trial notice. Costs will be broken into Participation Fee's and Uniform fees, if applicable.

Trials & Team Selection Process

- Trial details will be communicated via morning notices leading up to selection events.
- Selection is based solely on trial performance, with some previous experience also considered in making selections.
- Mt Maria College may adjust selection criteria in special circumstances.
- Where there are not enough players at a trial to select a team, players will be considered for an Open age groups team (where appropriate) or the team will be removed.
- Participation may be restricted for students who do not meet the College's behavioural expectations or breach the Sport Code of Conduct.
- Students selected for representative teams must maintain excellent attendance, behaviour, and academic performance. Failure to meet these standards may result in withdrawal from Tier 2 sport.
- A reminder if a student is not selected in a Representative Sport team following a trial, SECA Sport remains our main program at the College and students can participate in this program.

Training

- Training schedules are set by the coach, with strong consideration of facility usage and clashes with other sports
- Students are expected to attend all sessions; failure to do so may result in removal from the team.
- Students are expected to make training attendance their top priority
- Students are expected to notify coaching staff in advance whereby they are unable to attend a training session
- Students are expected to wear appropriate uniform/clothing attire for the activity. Students must not wear their formal uniform at a training session

Transport – Representative Sport Offerings

For events held after school hours or outside and/or outside of the Brisbane Region (such as the Gold Coast or Sunshine Coast), transportation is mostly NOT provided and is at the responsibility of the parent/carer, unless otherwise advertised. Where the College has the capacity to provide transportation, additional costs apply.

Coaches and Volunteers

The Representative Sport program is largely supported by volunteer staff employed full time in other areas of the College (e.g. fulltime teaching staff). Please be aware that staff are all volunteering their time outside of their professional duties, to provide additional opportunities to students in this space. As a result, the offerings each year may change – increase or decrease – dependent upon our coaching and administrative capacity. We welcome and support parents/carers/friends of students wishing to take on coaching roles to strengthen our capacity.

Representative Sport Uniform Expectations

All students participating in Tier 2 Representative Sport are required to follow the College's uniform guidelines as outlined in the Student Handbook and Daily Planner.

Tier 2 sporting uniforms—including hoodies, jerseys, socks, and other items—may only be worn when students are actively representing Mt Maria College at their designated sporting event.

Important Notes:

- Wearing representative sport uniforms outside of official events is not permitted.
- Students who do not comply with the College's uniform policy will have their representative sport items confiscated.
- Breaches will be addressed in accordance with Mt Maria College's procedures for incorrect uniform



North District (starting 2026!)

Beginning in 2026, **Met North School Sport** will implement a major restructure of its district sport program. This change involves the merging of several Brisbane districts to enhance the quality of trial processes and reduce the workload on individual schools. The new structure will provide a broader distribution of trial responsibilities across more schools.

What This Means for Parents and Students

- More Opportunities: Students will have increased access to district-level trials, with fewer cancellations and reduced instances of students being sent directly to Regional (Met North) trials.
- State and Independent Combine: Parents/students are to expect that the quality of the trial will be greater than that of the past, with students from both state and independent now coming together to compete for their place in the district team.

Key Changes for Mt Maria College

- From 2026, Mt Maria College will be part of the newly formed North District.
- Students must **nominate and attend their district trial** including the major carnivals: **Swimming, Cross Country, and Athletics** to be eligible for progression to Regional trials.
- Important Note: Nearby schools may now belong to different districts. Mt Maria students should not share or accept district nomination information from other schools in the North-West Corridor that are not members of the NORTH District (see below).
- Mt Maria College **will not be** held responsible for students who fail to register interest to the Sport office, nominate, or miss their district trial. (refer to the below nomination process).

Nominations

Students who are wishing to compete at a Regional or higher level, <u>MUST</u> nominate for district trials, including the big 3 carnivals (Swimming, Cross Country, and Athletics) from 2026 onwards.

In the event of successful selection in the North District team, students will progress to the Regional (Met North) trials.

Nomination Process:

- 1. Students to express interest to Sport Coordinator/Sport Admin at the START of the year ASAP please refer to the student notices posted early Term 1.
- 2. Parents will be sent a nomination form to complete in the weeks leading into a district trial a QR code to nominate their student directly
- 3. Parents will be sent all of the information & permission forms by the District officer (not the school) it's the parents responsibility to check email (and spam) and complete the paperwork

The school is removed from the nomination process after sending the QR Code Nomination form to those that have expressed interest. Failure to complete this form will result in the student being unable to trial.

Note:

- students MUST be nominated for the district trial in order to be considered for the district team.

 I.e. nominations will NOT be accepted after North District nomination dates have closed.
- students should only consider nominating if they take part in this sport at a state level.
- a call for nominations will occur in the first several weeks of school via the student notices, during
 which many trials may have already taken place students must express interest to the Sport
 Coordinator ASAP! Failure to express interest will result in the student not being nominated.
- it is not the responsibility of Mt Maria staff to provide transport, uniforms, equipment, or trial information to athletes or families.

Mt Maria College will **not be held responsible** for students who fail to register interest to the Sport office, nominate, or miss their district trial.

Transport & Supervision – QLD School Sport Pathway

District and Regional pathways are an individual endeavour, meaning that Mt Maria College does not officially select or send students/teams to these events. As a result, parents or carers are responsible for the transportation of their student to and from the trial venue and are also responsible for the supervision of their student between games.

Mt Maria College will endeavour to recognise the achievements of all students in sport, both at club and through school pathways, within our regular newsletters. It is the responsibility of individual student to inform the Sports Program Leader and Sports Program Administrative Assistant of achievements in a timely manner for this to occur. On the odd occasion, and at the discretion of the media team, specific sporting achievements may also feature on the College's Facebook and/or Instagram media pages — this is **limited to National Events only and one post per year** (subject to change at the discretion of the media team). The media team may also only select

achievements of students from within School Sporting contexts to feature. If media consent is not provided by parents or guardians, the College will refrain from recognising student achievement on these platforms in line with the media consent policies.

The College Sports Awards evening is a celebration of student sporting achievements throughout the year. The following accolades will be recognised on the evening:

Sportsman & Sportswoman of the Year

For major sporting awards, such as Sportsman and Sportswoman of the year award, specific set criteria are applied, and calculations are made, to determine the recipient of these awards. To do so, it is the responsibility of individual students to inform the Sports Program Leader of your club/external sporting commitments and achievements. The College takes no responsibility where a student (or family member) has failed to inform the Sports Department of representative honours and is not included in the final calculations of major awards or representative recognition awards. The College will utilise information it has on file to be able to calculate and determine the recipients of these awards – points allocated to students based on their participation and achievements within School Sporting environments only.

Code of Conduct

Representing Mt Maria College in any sport is a privilege. Considering this, the importance of adhering to a Code of Conduct ensures that players, coaches and officials are able to perform their tasks to the best of their ability, unhindered by inappropriate conduct.

The following Code of Conduct highlights the level of expected behaviour of players when participating in sport at Mt Maria College, whether that be training or in competition. Consequences for not honouring this code of conduct are listed below. Please ensure that you have read and understand this code prior to participating in training and competitions. For further information please contact Kyle Donaldson (Mt Maria College Sports Coordinator).

Student Expectations

Exhibit behaviour within the school community prior to representation that signifies a capacity to
represent Mt Maria College to an acceptable standard as a member of a team. Students who fail to
demonstrate these capacities may be withdrawn from a school team.
School behaviour and commitment to studies will be of an acceptable standard, otherwise a student
may not be allowed to represent the College in co-curricular activities. This decision could be made at
any time leading up to or during a sporting competition.
Be on time to all training sessions and <u>notify the coach</u> if you are unable to make it. You may be required
to provide a note from your parent or guardian explaining why you could not attend training.
Follow all directions of the coach (including playing to the team structures) as stipulated by the coach.
Show respect for yourself, your teammates, officials, your opponents, and their abilities.
Never argue with or question the Referee's decision.
Control your temper – no criticism by word or gesture
Compete by the competition conditions and rules.
Be a good sport. Encourage and support your own team members.
Work equally hard for yourself and your team
Behave in a manner that respects the rights of others regardless of mediums of communication used
e.g. digital mediums such as Twitter, Facebook, email and texts.
Wear the official team uniform at all times, including purchasing items if needed, as directed by team
coach/school.
Stay in the designated team area and support other team members during times when you are not
competing.
No swearing on and off the field.
Ultimately, take responsibility for your own behaviour and performance.

Breach Consequences

Team coaches will deal immediately with any breaches of this code by imposing appropriate consequences. Some of these may include:

- Verbal warning to student identifying breaches of the code
- Formal meeting with coach and Sports Coordinator
- Notification to parents
- Removal from the team
- Suspension from all school and representative sport

Additional Supporters Information

Please note, all Mt Maria supporters, including family members (not limited to parents/guardians), friends and student supporters are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which reflects the values, beliefs and expectations of Mt Maria College. This will also include **respecting the decisions made by the coaching team in relation to team selections and utilisation of players on the court/field.**

Identified breaches will be reported to the College Principal and supporters may be banned from attending Mt Maria College sporting events, including the College Sports Awards evening.
